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
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


YSM Governing Body Member Profiles

Lt Gen Gyan Bhushan PVSM, UYSM, AVSM, VSM, ADC




Dr. Shyam Pandey M.Tech (IITR); Ph.D Principal YSM

Sri Siddharth Tripathi (Commissioner (MGNREGA)



Introduction





Yogoda Satsanga Educational Institutions (YSEI) is a group of non-profit and charitable educational institutions running under the aegis of Yogoda Satsanga Society of India (YSS), and has a religious minority status. Sri Sri Paramahansa Yogananda, author of the spiritual classic *Autobiography of a Yogi*, founded the society in 1917, with the view to disseminating the ancient yogic teachings for balanced development of body, mind, and soul. One of the *Aims and Ideals* of YSS is "Serving mankind as one's larger Self", which serves as the mission statement for YSEI. Under this mission statement, YSEI plans its goals and objectives.

The institution receives its inspiration from the mahavakya propagated by Bhagavan Krishna in the Bhagvad Gita: "तद्वद्धि प्रिणपातेन परिप्रश्नेन सेवया।"(IV, 34)—meaning, "a disciple who is in tune with the guru: by self-surrender, by intelligent questions, and by selfless service, learns through unalterable devotion to perceive the Spirit behind the egoless transparency of the guru's personality."

The educational endeavour of YSS started Sri Sri Paramahansa Yoganandaji starting a school by name Yogoda Satsanga Brahmacharya Vidyalaya in 1917 to impart true education with values and traditions, and to develop body, mind and soul in a balanced way. Initially the school was established in Dihika, West Bengal and later was shifted to Ranchi. In 1964, YSS decided to expand its education activities to higher education and established a college in Palpara (West Bengal). In 1967, it established another college in Ranchi (Bihar). Presently the society is running 17 schools, 2 colleges and many allopathic and homeopathic medical dispensaries across India. The society has been relentlessly imparting quality education for one-hundred years.

Sri Sri Paramahansa Yoganandaji believed that progress is measured not merely by what one knows, but by what one does and is, in all facets of one's being. It is related to one's personality and actions, and is attained through practising the ideals such as consideration and thoughtfulness, patience and perseverance, clear thinking and intuition, will power and determination, thereby emphasizing on practical applications of true education, rather than crammed-up information gathering and rote learning.





Campus:

The Mid-semester examination is conducted by the Mahavidyalaya within its premises /online whereas the End-semester examination is conducted by the University for which it allots some other college as the examination Center.

The Mid-semester examination is conducted for the core and Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) papers and is of 25 marks for non-practical papers and of 15 marks for papers having practical. The pass marks are 10 and 6 respectively for the Mid-semester examination. The end semester examination is conducted for both core as well as elective papers. The detailed modalities and marking scheme of examinations may be downloaded from the websites of either Mahavidyalaya, www.ysmranchi.net or Ranchi University, www.ranchiuniversity.ac.in.

Online tests, various exams like mid semester, practicals and end semester exams of generic subjects were successfully conducted during previous academic session. In alignment with Ranchi University policy as per the new normal trends post Covid 19, the Mahavidyalaya has actively incorporated online exams/ tests from 2020.



Game & Sports:





Admission:

The admission for the session 2022-25 is being done only in Online mode through the Mahavidyalaya's website www.ysmranchi.net.

Students seeking admission in Degree and post-graduate programmes of the Mahavidyalaya may download the prospectus free of cost from the College's website. The students will have to register themselves with the Mahavidyalaya for filling up the Application Form on payment of the requisite registration fee.

Students will have to fill in all fields in the online application form and upload her/his recent colour passport size photograph and scanned copies of her/his class 12/Intermediate



admit card and mark sheet and class 10/matriculation admit card and mark sheet. Students must maintain utmost caution regarding accuracy of details filled-in and especially in providing their e-mail id and contact details as these will be used for any further communication with the applying students.

Students having the requisite marks as declared by admission committee at the time of admission, in the qualifying examination (Class 12 or equivalent) may directly take admission after submission of duly filled in application forms along with the required documents as listed above.

Direct admission will be given to applying students on the basis of the category wise cut off marks displayed on the College's website. The admission department will approve the admission of the student within 72 hours of the application. A confirmation message will be sent to the student's registered mobile number/email Id after which s/he may take online admission on payment of the requisite admission fee. The students need to take admission within a week from receipt of this e-mail failing which the admission will stand cancelled.

The online fee payment system is routed through payment gateway and may be paid using any means of online payment: Debit/credit cards of any bank, UPI, Payment Gateways, Internet banking, Mobile banking, etc. Students are advised to make payment themselves and stay away from any third party/agents.

Students are required to download and preserve the online payment receipts of registration and admission for future references. Any discrepancies arising due to double payment/payment done and receipt not generated etc. must be immediately reported to the email id: ysmadmission@gmail.com

Inclusiveness: The Mahavidyalaya in its quest to provide equal opportunity to the weaker sections of the society and to contribute towards the national policy of inclusive growth gives encouragement to female applicants and applicants belonging to SC/ST/EBC categories by laying down a lenient admission criteria in terms of lowered percentage of cut-off marks.



General Rules:

- 1. Applicants will have to produce original documents for verification as soon as the college reopens.
- 2. Students mandatorily need to maintain 75% attendance throughout a semester to qualify for filling up the examination form.
- 3. In case of absence from the class for 6 consecutive days without any prior information and genuine reason, the name of the absenting student will be struck off from the attendance register. Such students will have to seek permission of their HoD and pay re-admission fee for attending their classes after this. On repetition of this act the student will be expelled from the Mahavidyalaya.
- 4. No student is allowed to use Mobile phones on campus except for academic purpose. Fine will be imposed on students caught using mobile phones for non-academic purpose on campus and their phones will be ceased and returned only to their parent/guardian.
- 5. All students are strictly required to abide by the rules and regulations notified and communicated by the Mahavidyalaya.
- 6. The Mahavidyalaya has a zero tolerance policy against ragging. Any student found involved in any act of ragging will be liable for immediate expulsion from the Mahavidyalaya.
- 7. The Mahavidyalaya has a zero tolerance policy against any form of discrimination gender based indiscipline. Any student found involved in any form of discrimination will be liable for expulsion/strict disciplinary action, as the case may be.
- 8. The Mahavidyalaya is strictly narcotics and tobacco free zone. Students found using any narcotic or tobacco product will be imposed fine. Any repetition by the student will make him/ her liable for immediate expulsion from the Mahavidyalaya.












World Earth Day 2022 Celebrations at YSM
