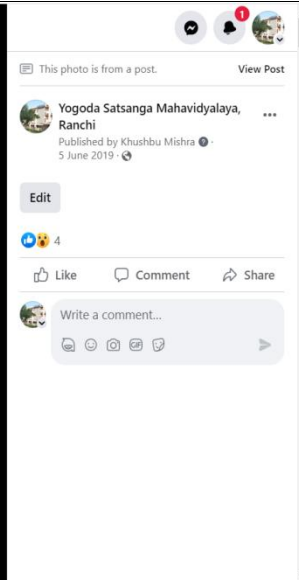

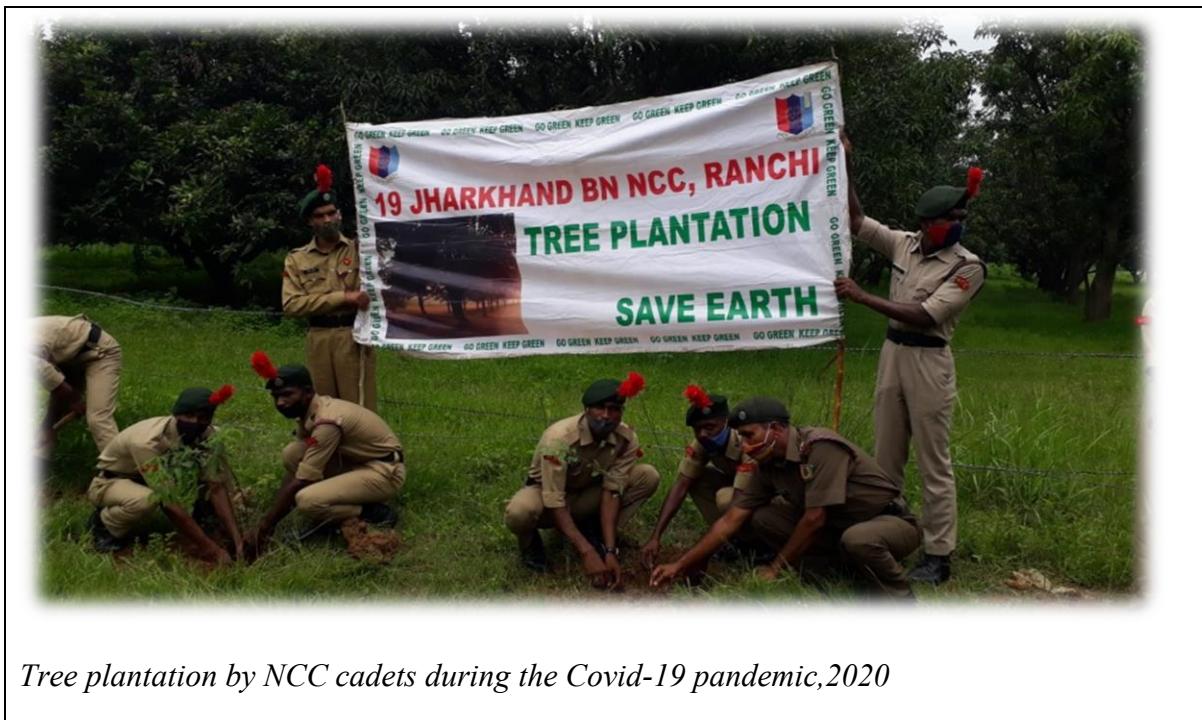
Tree Plantation -NCC- 28th July to 1st August 2020

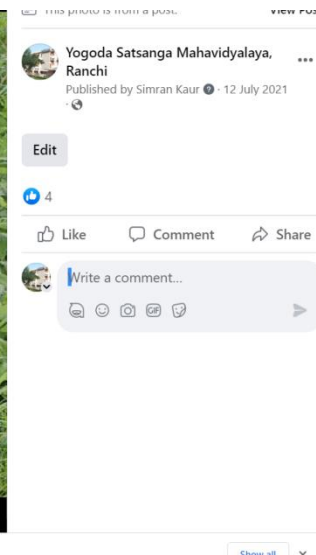
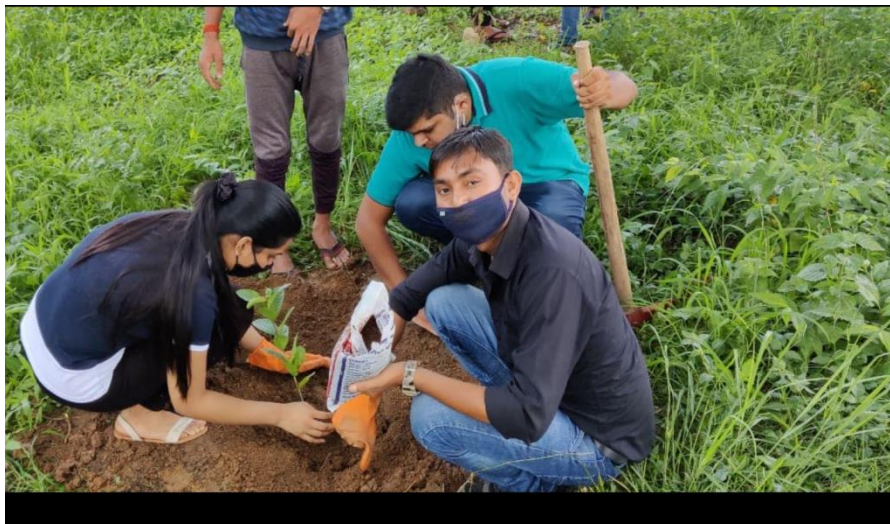
