




Figure: Academic Calendar Displayed on the University Website for the Affiliating University.

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






Figure: Academic Calendar for Various Academic Years Published on the College Website.

Faculty members from different faculties are selected as Routine-In-Charges. They prepare routines for their respective faculties. The routine is submitted to the Academic Council for approval.



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


Fig: Latest composition of the Academic Council of the College

Discussions and Resolutions

I. Rescheduling the classes of the Degree and Intermediate students.

- Prof. Ratnesh Pathak presented a detailed plan about the allocation of rooms along with its timing after conducting a detailed feasibility analysis of the same considering the classroom rements for each course (Intermediate &Degree).
- Mr. Rajeev Mishra, Coordinator of the Intermediate section was telephonically consulted over the phone before finalization. Post consultation, it was finally resolved to run Intermediate Science and Arts along with Degree & PG Commerce in the morning shift. i.e., from 7:45 am to 11: 30 am. The classes of Intermediate Commerce and Degree (Science &Arts) will commence from 11: 45 am. It was decided with the consent of all that the new routine would be implemented from 21st November 2022(Monday). Meanwhile, the routine may be prepared and circulated amongst the students
- To stay informed about the allocation of classes to individual faculty member Dr. Shyam Pandey suggested that a faculty wise routine should be prepared. Dr. PK Jha, Dr. N.N. Chaudhary and Dr. Anjana Verma would verify and sign the routine so prepared to avoid any mistake/error.
- Prof. Sarkar requested that a non-teaching staff may be deployed to take care of the printing requirements of the department/faculty members. Mannu Ram ji was identified to do the needful

- It was brought to light that many of the students have not yet opted for the IRC and IVC papers. It was also suggested that we may consider MOU agree premier institutions in the concerned domain to facilitate the running of the above courses.


Campus Discipline

- . To maintain the discipline, it was resolved that I-D cards should be made mandatory while entering the college gate and whilst the students' stay in the campus. The Professor-in-charge (Academics) informed that the process of printing and distribution of ID-cards to the newly admitted students is still pending and needs to be expedited.
- Dr. Anjana Verma informed that the security guards deployed at the gate need to be oriented to restrict entry of outsiders and to ensure the safety of the vehicles parked by the students in and around the campus. The principal suggested her to hold one session to orient them to which she agreed.
- Dr. Gaurav suggested to have paid parking facility for the students to ensure increased safety of the vehicles parked in the campus, to which all the members agreed. It was decided to outsource this parking related service for our students based on the recommendation of the employees of the Mahavidyalaya.
- . Dr. Gauray suggested that the entry of the students to the academic block should be restricted while the classes are going on. Students who are late beyond 5 minutes, should be allowed entry only after the bell goes.
- It was decided that faculty present in the campus may be deputed/nominated to ensure students' discipline during the class hours. The Head of the Department Commerce would ensure campus discipline during the classes of Intermediate and degree(commerce) in the morning shift. Also, Assistant Proctor of commerce and intermediate arts should be asked to ensure discipline in the campus.
- To ensure the availability of learning resources, students should be granted access to the library. The opening hours of the library must be adjusted accordingly.



Department of Commerce: - Online Classes through ZOOM Meeting






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Department of CA/IT: - Online Classes Through ZOOM Meeting




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

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(iii) Student-Centric Teaching Methods including Experiential Learning and Participative methods to enhance Learning Experience

On the 16th of May 2023, the Department of Botany organized a educational tour to the Biodiversity Park and Jharkhand Forest Nursery, located in Namkum, Ranchi.

Group Discussions:



Faculty encourages students to participate in seminars and presentations, fostering communication skills and self-confidence.



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

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Assessment Strategies:

Pattern of Internal /External Assessment

As an affiliated college of Ranchi University, YSM adheres to the university's regulations regarding the internal assessment, which is based on the mid-semester examination carrying 25% weightage for undergraduate (UG) core papers and 30% weightage for postgraduate courses. The remaining 75% weightage for undergraduate courses and 70% weightage for postgraduate courses is allocated to the external assessment, which is based on the End Semester Exam conducted by Ranchi University. Besides that, the NEP curriculum has been embraced by the college since the Academic year 2022-23, wherein there is a provision of internal assessment of 25 marks of which 5 marks are accorded to attendance as well. Both internal and external assessments have descriptive as well as multiple-choice questions which provide an understanding of not only the conceptual subject knowledge but also the writing skills of the students. The project is a part of the curriculum in a few courses in which besides the project report writing, the viva voce examination is conducted in the presence of both internal as well as external examiners. These project-based assignments help assess their creativity, problem-solving skills, and confidence besides their domain knowledge.

(a) Major (MJ1) - Discipline Specific: This component focuses on specialize to each discipline, ensuring in-depth knowledge and expertise in the respective




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- (b) Common Courses (CC) Across Disciplines: These courses are shared by students from
